

**DISTRICT COUNCIL OF GRANT  
REGISTER OF BY LAWS**

4. Review of Council By-Laws – [15.13.1/3] Item 11.7.4

Council's By-laws are required to be reviewed every seven (7) years. New By-laws need to be operational by 1 January 2015. Council's reviewed By-laws were presented for adoption by Council and resolutions sought in respect of certain By-law designated areas.

Moved Cr Collins that:-

1. In the exercise of the powers contained in section 246 of the Local Government Act 1999, having satisfied the consultation requirements of the Act, and after having had regard to the outcome of public consultation in relation to the proposed by-laws, the National Competition Policy Report, the Certificates of Validity provided by the Council's legal practitioner, the letter of approval from the Minister of Transport in respect of the Local Government Land By-law and the recommendations from the Dog and Cat Management Board in relation to the Dogs By-law, the majority of Council, in the presence of at least two thirds of its members hereby makes and passes the following by-laws as attached:
  - Permits and Penalties By-law No. 1 of 2014;
  - Local Government Land By-law No. 2 of 2014;
  - Roads By-law No. 3 of 2014;
  - Moveable Signs By-law No. 4 of 2014; and
  - Dogs By-law No. 5 of 2014
2. The Chief Executive Officer be authorised to take all necessary steps to finalise the By-law review process including arranging for the publication of the adopted By-laws in the Government Gazette, and forwarding them to the Legislative Review Committee of Parliament for review;
3. Pursuant to the power contained in 246(5)(b) of the Local Government Act 1999, the Council resolves that for the purposes of clause 9.1.2 of By-law No. 1 – Permits & Penalties 2014, once it is operational, the expiation fee payable for an offence under a Council By-law is \$50.00;

4. Pursuant to the power contained in section 246(3)(e) of the Local Government Act 1999, the Council resolves that, once operational, clause 9.9.1 of By-law No. 2 – Local Government Land 2014 will apply to prohibit a person from launching or retrieving a boat to or from the waters adjacent to:
  - a. the land between Smiths Road, Port MacDonnell extending to the beach access road at the eastern end of the Port MacDonnell Foreshore Tourist Park, and
  - b. the township of Blackfellows Caves
 other than by way of using the boat ramp that is permanently located in each of these areas.
5. Pursuant to the power contained in section 246(3)(e) of the Local Government Act 1999, the Council resolves that, once operational, clause 9.10.1 of By-law No. 2 – Local Government Land 2014 will apply to the boat ramps located on:
  - a. Section 804, Hundred MacDonnell (Tenterden Reserve, Sea Parade, Port MacDonnell); and
  - b. Section 621, Hd Kongorong (Blackfellows Caves).
6. Pursuant to the power contained in section 246(3)(e) of the Local Government Act 1999, the Council resolves that, once operational, clause 9.1.1 of By-law No. 5 – Dogs 2014 regarding dog on-leash areas, will apply to:
  - a. From Smiths Road, Port MacDonnell, extending to the beach access road at the eastern end of the Port MacDonnell Foreshore Tourist Park;
  - b. Port MacDonnell Foreshore Tourist Park located at 12 Eight Mile Creek Road, Port MacDonnell;
  - c. all Council owned sportsgrounds as identified in the Council's Community Land Register;
  - d. Clarke Park, located at Springs Road, Port MacDonnell
  - e. Lions Park, located at the corner of Compton Street and Sea Parade, Port MacDonnell;
  - f. Donovans Landing Reserve, located at Donovans Landing Access Road, Donovans;
  - g. Unger Recreational Reserve, located at Hammer Parade, Blackfellows Caves; and
  - h. Volunteer Park, located at the corner of Charles and Meylin Streets, Port MacDonnell.
